Jane prepared the agenda but Chuck felt well enough to facilitate and opened the meeting at 6:04 with our regional prayer and a prayer from Richard Rohr for political holiness.

Regular Business

1. Welcome Visitors: none

2. Agenda approval/additions

Two additions: Bishop/regional evaluation form and presentation of Fr Teri's PhD dissertation.

3. Review and approval of October notes

Not everyone saw or received Gayle Craun's final draft of the October notes. Jane asked Gayle to resend them and the Council will do final review and approvals via email.

4. Financial report

Greg presented his financial report: income, expenses and balances. At the Council's request, he added a spreadsheet that shows actuals -vs- budgeted running totals which clarifies our year-to-date financial status against the budget – we're on track. Treasurer report approved as submitted. Greg noted the absence of a Sep tithe from Mary of Magdala. Tom will check with Yvonne. Greg asked Light of Christ to send checks to his address on Ridgeview Lane.

5. Bishop's report

Kae received few responses from RMRC members to her request for Synod feedback, most from non-RMRC delegates. She collated and distributed those with her Bishop's report. A few other responses were written but didn't get sent to her Due to scheduling conflicts, the bishop gathering after the Synod didn't happen as usual. In an upcoming meeting, the bishops will examine the inputs from Rob's visioning exercise and discuss how to proceed forward. Kae has been on vacation after the Synod. Other topics from her report were discussed as separate agenda items. (See Appendix A)

6. Vicar's report

Michael noted that links to Synod recordings on Youtube are posted on the regional website as well as the ECC anti-racism statement that was read by Synod attendees and video-taped by Marisa Werner. Other topics from his report were also covered as separate agenda items. (See Appendix B)

7. Leadership Council Report

Teri Harroun still has some matters.to tie up with the Leadship Council, specifically concerning vice-chair for HOL but intends to resume attending RMRC meetings in January 2025. Tom clarified that at the HOL house meeting at Synod, no one had stepped forward to serve as vice-chair but PB Pablo announced Erin and John Duffy-Burke in that role during the Synod closing ceremony. Tom noted that the HOL did not explicitly affirm the HOL leadership as has been done in prior Synods. Dennis believed that no objections raised during the closing implied an implicit affirmation but wondered about 2 persons sharing one leadership role. Ensuing discussion supported a shared leadership role as long as together they have only one vote.

8. Truth and Reconciliation Commission

Jane again expressed appreciation for the RMRC's financial support for the T&R at Synod as well as gratitude for mentions by +Pablo and others. Synod attendees were very supportive of the materials presented at the T&R table and folks signed up for 1619 Project study groups and expressed interest in the pilgrimage to Montgomery in April 2025. The RMRC money covered all the Synod T&R expenses allowing a little to be set aside for future use including possible pilgrimage scholarships. Carol Persons on behalf of a Mary of Magdala Spiritual Reading Group offered a study group of The False White Gospel to anyone in the ECC.

9. Week of Prayer for Christian Unity.

Michael proposed changing the date because Jan 20, 2025 is Martin Luther King day. Kae proposed switching to Tues, Jan 21. Kae will initiate a planning sessions with Jane and Tom who have volunteered to help organize.

10. Regional Synod 2025 Planning Team

Rosean proposed rescheduling the Regional Synod in Oct 2025 to coincide with the month of the National ECC Synod in even years and to allow some extra time for planning. Kae noted that Bp Kedda is scheduling a regional Synod for the Pacific Northwest that will be more retreat-like. Several Council members supported that idea, especially if there is not much business or legislation to address. Don raised the importance and power of praying together. Dennis and others noted that the bishop and regional leadership evaluation may raise issues that should be addressed at a regional Synod. Kae requested that Council members extend feelers to their respective communities to ask for focus and seek volunteer organizers. The goal is to identify planners by January and follow up with more discussion in our Dec RMRC meeting.

11. Michael's Relocation

Marc will resume interviewing for new job opportunities in the spring. Jane kept Michael's relocation on the agenda as a reminder that we need replacement for Michael's role as Vicar for Ecumenical Engagement and to stay attuned to moving plans.

12. Continuing Education for Clergy

Fr Scott Jenkins will own managing the status of clergy education and safety training. Kae has not spoken to him on this topic recently. Rosean will continue to keep records.

13. Community Updates

- MofM: Fr Teri has announced to the community that she will no longer be presiding at MofM come January to focus on her healing. We'll celebrate her and express appreciation for her 13 years of service at her last Mass on the first Sunday in December. We celebrated a combined liturgy and adult ed focused on immigration on Oct 20. Jane continues to lead prayer for peace on Monday mornings which now also integrates silent reflection.
- LOC: Jack Wolfe's widow recently passed away and a Celebration of her Life is scheduled Nov 15.
- COB: Completed annual hat, scarves and mittens collection for Samaritan House and Precious Child. Kae and Gregg Madden coordinated prayer times during election days. On the two Saturdays after Synod, delegates offered reflections. Julia Halaby will facilitate a presentation with a member of the Jewish community on the history that has lead to the current reality in Palestine followed by guided table discussions. Kae will send out the Zoom link for anyone interested.
- STP: Participated in a prayer service by UCC before the election. Pastor Chris did exceptional job. Sense of unity. Celebrated the building's 100th anniversary gala.
 Prayer group meets daily and Don would like this to become a regional prayer group. A book group has been discussing Trish Vanni's Reconstructing Catholicism. Fundraising cabaret and silent auction Dec 15.
- CHF: Jane mentioned impacts of Regina's son-in-laws's death liturgy committee is working through liturgical changes as a result. Mike Weil's Mass on Nov 24 precedes his internship at LOC – all are invited to attend.

New Business

1. Updates Debrief on Holy Synod

Kae opened the discussion to whatever people wanted to do to review the Synod. Dennis was an observer but felt like a delegate. He thought the Sunday Mass was amazing, enjoyed shared connections with other delegates, and felt great to be there. Liz loved it but is overwhelmed right now with political holiness – discussion went a bit off-topic. Jane offered that the the younger communities with Trish Vanni and Mir Plemmons had different perspectives and suggested that they be seriously considered and carry a different weight. She added that Fr Rickey's presentation on virtual attendance and changing trends warrant more thought and reflection. Rosean liked Bishop Pablo's setting the stage with the "Saint Buddy" exercise which built an ongoing friendship that deepened during the rest of Synod. The multi-building venue and landscape proved tough with her walker and she appreciated Dennis providing rides. Chuck asked about seeking more written responses. Kae would welcome other community/delegate inputs. When compiled, we should include these comments as an appendix to meeting notes.

2. Introduction to Rev. Dr. Jenny Whitcher, Minister of Prophetic Formation

Michael emailed out Jenny's pitch which describes what the conference will be like and elicits needs and desires from partnering organizations. The conference will be in Denver with a remote participation option. Sponsorship pledges are needed by end of the year to enable conference planning and keep registrations at \$100. Michael informed her that we are small with limited financial resources but may be able to provide some volunteers. Michael has also raised the possibility of workshops on virtual communities. She is interested in coming to RMRC meeting in Dec to discuss all of this. Jane hopes the conference may identify

marginalized people who, post-election, might need ECC help. The group consensus was to proceed with inviting her to December's RMRC meeting at 6:15.

3. Bishop/Vicar/RMRC Evaluation Form

Appreciation expressed to Chuck for his great work at developing draft evaluation, particularly how the cover letter concisely but informatively describes key bishop responsibilities. Some didn't have time to read and reflect on the draft. The scope has broadened from a bishop evaluation to now also assess the vicar and RMRC roles. Chuck suggested we kick this around a little more via email and need a due date. Ensuing discussion focused on scope and then heavily on who will complete the evaluation. How many will have a real critique? People who are uninformed should not complete it. The conversation also challenged each community to examine how we communicate the work of the bishop, vicar and council. We agreed to discuss this further via emails and make it a priority after the holidays.

4. Fr Teri Presents Her Dissertation

Growing interest in reading the dissertation or hearing her present it. Kae will check with Teri about presenting it only to members of the region, on Zoom, Nov 21
